Supermom – support for single parents – welcome to the new EU funded project

We are looking forward to introduce you to the Supermom-project which aims to support the labour market integration of unemployed single parents. The project is funded by the EU Lifelong Learning Program Leonardo da Vinci.

Single parents are an increasing family structure in the EU. Unemployment among this group is, for various reasons, significantly higher than for parents who live together as a couple. In Europe, as almost everywhere in the world, single parents belong to the population group with the highest risk of poverty and hence they are strongly threatened by social exclusion.

“Supermom Kick-Off 2010” takes the best practices and ideas from successful prior initiatives and EU funded projects for lone parents and aims at a raise of competences of the participating mostly single mothers in order to increase their chances at the labour market.

After a first research and adaptation period, the project offers its beneficiaries free workshops including:

- Empowerment: competence analysis and confidence building in combination with vocational orientation, personal and social skills training
- Vocational training in media: theoretical and practical information about different film related professions in form of workshops, information about job opportunities and details about further education
- Practical implementation

One main outcome will be a film created by single parents in the different partner countries. In different newsletters and at our website www.supermom-kick-off.eu we will keep you informed about the progress.

Kick-off meeting in Leipzig

In November 2010 the foundation was laid for the two-year EU project “Supermom-Kick-Off 2010”. Mrs. Sabine Roehrig-Mahhou, Director of the project promoter wisamar educational institute, together with Jana Dobbstein welcomed the project coordinators in Leipzig.

The participants from Germany, France, Italy, Northern Ireland and Poland had the chance to clarify the concrete project planning and the most appropriate ways to reach the ambitious aims of the project.

It is aim of every project meeting to involve national stakeholders, representatives from lone parent associations, mother centers, film funding, media as well as employment offices etc. for a presentation as well as an exchange about the topic.

Anne Sweeney and Karen McCann for the UK / Northern Ireland, Marie Rouffort for France, Agnieszka Borowicz-Bartosik together with

Magdalena Bujak for Poland as well as Mirna Fusaro and Roberta Bassan for Italy gave presentations about the situation of single parents in their country. Brunhild Fischer from the German lone parent association SHIA e.V. allowed the participants an insight in the German situation. Ariane Jedlitschka and Matthias Petzoldt showed two teasers of the “Supermutti” created by German single parents and explained their concept. Their film project together with the German and Northern Irish Empower / Motivate courses build the basis for the new EU project Supermom.

We thank all guests, among those Monika Lazar, member of the German Parliament, the representatives of the Middle German Media Funding and the Center for Unemployed, for participating.

Introducing of the partners

Helden wider Willen e.V.

The non-profit association Helden wider Willen e.V. was founded in 2006 in Leipzig, Germany, and has currently 15 members. The objective is a contribution to cultural practice. The rapprochement of arts and culture and consumers of everyday life should be reached with different projects like festivals and markets, exhibitions or socio-cultural film projects like Supermutter 2007 for single mothers which was funded by the ESF.

Supermutter 2007 is one basis of the Supermom Kick-Off 2010 project. Because of its experiences in film making with the target group, Helden wider Willen takes over the responsibility of the work package "Preparation and conception of the movie".

Helden wider Willen runs the "EEG- essential existence gallery" as an alternative space for art and artists, creative professionals and people interested in new media and technologies.

The members of the cooperative association arrange concerts, exhibitions, workshops, project-based co-working spaces and other initiatives related to the sectors of art, education and emerging technologies.

Through Helden wider Willen's broad competence in teaching and didactics, our familiarity with virtual and visual culture, and an emphasis on interdisciplinary teamwork, we are able to create and implement innovative pilot projects. We also offer project advising and complete planning and support services for art projects run by other organisations.

CNA-CEFAG

The French partner CNA-CEFAG is a vocational training centre created in 1989 and specialized in graphic arts and multimedia. 2000 people are trained in the centre each year.

Because of its experiences in the media sector, the centre is responsible for the implementation period, the film making, and will organise the final event, the film premiere in Paris.

Its team of some sixty employees and as many associated service providers develop training initiatives by apprenticeship through CFA'com (the Multimedia and Visual Communication Training Centre) from vocational qualification to higher professional qualification (Master), and for young and adult trainees doing vocational and further training. CNA-CEFAG is also managing an inclusion platform helping young people facing great difficulties in developing their professional project, and training formal and soft skills. Its staff developed fully recognized professional titles composed of professional skills credits independently validated. They also develop innovative educational tools, mainly IT supports and manage an independent learning platform.
